

Mission and Vision

- To support the Eastern Black Sea Region's rise to regional leadership in areas such as coastal tourism and water sports by organizing a maritime event in Trabzon, a key hub along the historic Silk Road.
- To bring together regional actors such as Romania and Bulgaria to the west, Georgia to the east, and Ukraine and Russia to the north, ensuring the Black Sea region plays a more active role in all areas of the blue economy.
- To rapidly transform the Black Sea Yacht Races into an event with global following and participation, and to expand this potential to Central Europe and the Caucasus through the Danube and Don Rivers.

Tourism in Trabzon

- According to tourism data from the Provincial Directorate of Tourism, there was a 10.02% decrease in the number of international flight arrivals in the first nine months of 2024.
- Between January and September 2024, 322,034 people from Saudi Arabia stayed in Trabzon. This was followed by Oman with 47,682, Iran with 33,223, and Iraq with 30,595.
- When the data is examined, it becomes clear that tourism is highly dependent on a specific region. According to the same data, the average time tourists visiting Trabzon spend in the city is 8.5 days, with half of this time spent in Uzungöl and other rural facilities.
- Cruise tourism, on the other hand, increased in the first nine months of 2024. In 2023, 12 cruise ships visited Trabzon, and this year, 18 cruises were organized.

Economic Contributions of Yacht Races

1

The Economic Impact of the 2022–2023 "The Ocean Race" Yacht Races and 2024 Perspectives

According to a report published by independent research firm **PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC)**, the "**The Ocean Race**" yacht races held **in Spain in 2022–2023** contributed a total of **€71.6 million** to the national economy. During the event, a noticeable economic recovery was experienced, particularly in the accommodation, food and beverage, and souvenir sectors. The direct contribution to local businesses supported the regional economy, and tourism revenues increased.

Expectations for 2024: Similar water sports events are planned to be held on a larger scale across Europe in 2024. Mediterranean countries such as Spain, Portugal, and Italy, in particular, have made yacht races a part of their tourism strategies. To this end:

- Promotional and advertising activities aim to enhance the region's tourism diversity.
- In line with sustainable tourism principles, reducing environmental impacts and integrating the local community into events have become key priorities.
- The economic impact of the events organized in 2024 is expected to exceed **€80 million**.
- Such sporting events contribute value to the region not only economically but also culturally and socially, while increasing the international visibility of destinations.

Economic Contributions of Yacht Races

2

- According to statistics published by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, the total number of tourists entering our country by **commercial and private (sailing) yachts in 2023 was 296,005**.
- Yacht tourism (marine tourism) in Türkiye has shown significant growth in recent years and now accounts for **25% of total tourism revenues**.



Economic Contributions of Yacht Races

3

- Another area positively influenced by yacht racing, thanks to its target audience, is cruise tourism.
- The global market size of cruise tourism, in terms of ships alone, has reached **\$36 billion**.
- According to data from the Chamber of Maritime Commerce, **the average amount spent on board by a cruise tourist during a 7-day voyage is \$1,719**. This figure does not include expenditures made by cruise tourists outside the ship.
- **A cruise tourist spends approximately three times more than an average tourist.**



Economic Contributions of Yacht Races

4

- According to the TÜRSAB Sports Tourism Report, **more than 550,000 foreign tourists traveled to Türkiye in 2014 for sporting activities, generating over \$900 million** in expenditures. **Sports tourism accounts for approximately 1.5% of total tourism in Türkiye**, with golf and football taking the largest shares. **A sports tourist spends on average twice as much as a regular tourist.**
- The same report also states that in 2014, within a global tourism industry approaching \$1.2 trillion in size, **the share of sports tourism reached around \$180 billion**. While global tourism grows at an annual rate of 4–5%, the growth rate of sports tourism reaches up to 14%.

Regional Impacts of the Blue Economy Summit

1

- According to data from the Provincial Directorate of Tourism, in 2023 there were 108 Ministry-certified tourism accommodation facilities, with a total of 5,258 rooms and a bed capacity of 10,940.
- In the same year, there were 139 facilities holding basic accommodation certificates, offering 3,404 rooms and a total bed capacity of 6,808.
- Our objective is to increase the number of daily excursion boats beyond the 15 vessels recorded in 2022.
- The purpose of this summit is to demonstrate the feasibility of daily excursion tours as well as sailing yacht, motor yacht, and cruise tourism. In neighboring countries, similar activities are easily implemented with much simpler infrastructure and make a significant contribution to tourism.

Regional Impacts of the Blue Economy Summit

2

- The Port of Sochi is one of the important ports in the Black Sea in terms of marine tourism.
- Despite having a much longer coastline compared to the Krasnodar Region, Türkiye has not been able to utilize this advantage effectively.
- According to data from the Provincial Directorate of Culture and Tourism, the number of travel agencies in Trabzon in 2023 was 296. As of 2023, the total number of tourists arriving in the city reached 1,319,299. A detailed study on this subject was conducted by the Provincial Directorate of Culture and Tourism.
- According to data from the Provincial Directorate of Tourism, 23 cruise ships docked in Trabzon in 2023, carrying a total of 16,728 passengers.

Regional Impacts of the Blue Economy Summit

3

- According to general tourism data published by the Georgian Ministry of Tourism, 7,072,220 tourists visited Georgia in 2023.
- Cruise tourism has been developing in Georgia's cities along the Black Sea coast.
- Touristic destinations and coastal areas attract strong interest from visitors; however, the Black Sea Region, despite having the longest coastline, receives only a very small share of this tourism activity.
- Our objective is to make marine tourism more efficient and to establish strong connections between investors and entrepreneurs.







Challenge Cup: A special, competition- and prestige-oriented trophy event in which different teams compete under defined courses or rules to demonstrate superiority.


